Bill Rogers, Assistant CAO, added that should Council want to have the fireworks during the Rodeo, the Rodeo Association suggested they would do it on the Saturday of the dance, and in exchange for the fireworks, the Rodeo Association would grant the Town a Platinum Sponsorship.

Mayor Sobolewski stated that he was concerned about attendance if the fireworks were held on another day other than Canada Day.

Councilor Storoschuk suggested the fireworks be held at next year's Canada Day Celebration.

Councillor Kunec stated that fireworks are a family affair and he agreed that it should be held next year at Canada Day. Councillor Cheverie added that the Town's fireworks are a

The Town was hoping to co-sponsor with the Municipal District of Bonnyville for the costs of upgrading the parking lot. Until the analysis comes back and the density is known, that is when the plan will come into play.

Mayor Sobolewski also attended the Regional Opportunities Committee meeting where a letter was formulated, with a refined ask, to approach the Provincial Government for a more reasonable distribution of the funds for ID 349. Mayor Sobolewski also participated in a showcase/raffle at the Lyle Victor Albert Center for the Children's Wish Foundation, organized by Riwa Kamaleddine, Miss East-Central Alberta. On Canada Day, he attended the Bonnyville Museum's Pancake Breakfast at Sobeys, delivered a speech at the Bonnyville Museum, rode on the Town Canada Day Float, and then attended the unveiling of the Canada 150 Mosaic. Councillor Cheverie stated that for a project that was less than a year old, this award was an amazing accomplishment.

Mayor Sobolewski added that when this project first started, the Province and Alberta Health Services declined funding, however the Town, M.D. of Bonnyville, Schools, Hospital and Clinic all collaborated together and moved forward with the project. This shows great initiative and strength in the North East.
