2021 Draft II Operational Budget

Council reviewed Draft II of the proposed 2021 Operational Budget which includes total expenditures of \$21,992,865 and has a deficit of \$932,746. Draft I of the 2021 Operating Budget had total expenditures of \$22,219,074 and a total deficit of \$1,633,360.

ATCO Contract Buy-Down Transfer Station

During the Town of Bonnyville annual review with AMSC Energy, it was suggested that there may be cost savings obtained by buying down the contract from ATCO for the Landfill Transfer Station. This site was originally set up with a load requirement of 147kW and is only using approximately 47kW.

Administration requested a quote from ATCO to buy down the contract; the amount of the buy down will be \$27,644.00 plus GST and the rate would be switched from D31 to D21 based on the load requirement for the site.

The annual cost savings, as a result of the switch in rates, would equate to approximately \$10,800.00 per year. The current contract end date for the D31 rate is August 25, 2033 which would mean a total cost saving on power at this site, until then, would be approximately \$137,700.00.



ATCO Contract Buy-Down Transfer Station

The letter in question, dated October 26, 2020, was sent by the WHL and AJHL to the Minister of Jobs, Economy and Innovation and the Minister of Culture, Multiculturalism and Status of Women requesting a proposed partnership with the government for funding of both leagues to ensure the highest level of Alberta amateur hockey systems survives the Covid-19 pandemic.

An email poll was sent out to Council and responses received were all in favor of adding the Town of Bonnyville to the Letter of Support.

Moved by Councillor Lorna Storoschuk that Council ratify the approval of adding the Town of Bonnyville to the Letter of Support, in principle, from the town of Okotoks to the Government of Alberta to support the WHL and AJHL funding request.
